

18 Years after Privatisatons House of Reps' Committee Exclaims:

"You Are Indeed The SUCCESS STORY of PRIVATISATION!"

...Promise to help in solving the shortage of Gas supply for the company's production.

The 10th National Assembly House of Representatives' Committee on Privatisation and Commercialisation came on a familiarisation visit to the Complex of Indorama-Nigeria in Port Harcourt on Monday, 12th February 2024 --- eighteen years after privatization. They were warmly received by Indorama Management team led by the Chief Technical Officer (CTO), Mr Deepu Sivadas who made a detailed presentation of the Indorama journey of excellence, while Anil Rana, Kendrick Oluka and Pradeep Ekka also came in at sections of the presentation concerning their respective areas namely gas, community relations and human resources.

he 13 Hon. Members as well as Clerk and consultant led by the Chairman Rt Hon Hamisu Ibrahim Chidari were later taken on a facility tour of the Complex where they visited the Fertilizer Train 2 Control

room, as well as the Fertilizer and Polyethylene (PE) Bagging/Warehouse sections.

The Chairman, said the Committee had heard so much about Indorama

and decided to come, as part of their oversight function, to see for themselves and know progress and challenges that the company is facing with a view to helping in solving the challenges.









The Committee members took their turns to ask questions on various areas of the presentation but in most cases commended Indorama-Nigeria for their innovation, visionary leadership, products that serve the economic need of Nigerians and the robust relationship with the host communities and its high corporate social responsibility initiatives that enhance the wellbeing of the people.

"We didn't know Indorama is as huge as this. I am convinced that Indorama is the best success story of privatization in Nigeria," the Chairman said after the facility tour.

"I want to join my colleagues in congratulating Indorama for all the achievements you have recorded since you took over the old Eleme Petrochemicals Company. You have added so much value to what you met on ground," said the Committee Chairman.

The Committee was deeply surprised that Indorama Eleme Petrochemicals Limited (IEPL) has invested heavily in innovating the polymer (petrochemicals) plants and now has a basket of 49 various grades of polyethylene and polypropylene – two raw materials that power about 450 plastics and allied companies in Nigeria and sustaining the jobs of thousands of Nigerians across the country.

They were equally surprised that Indorama has added fertilizer production into its kitty with its world-class Trains 1 and 2 fertilizer plants producing ammonia and a total of 3 million metric tons of Urea per annum while Train 3 is underway.

The Indorama fertilizer plants in Port Harcourt and Kaduna are the major

plants producing Urea (in PH) and NPK fertilizers (in Kaduna) for millions of farmers across the country.

Indorama also produces Urea, packaged in white bags, which it supplies to the Presidential Fertilizer Initiative (PFI) as the company keys into the agricultural revolution of the Federal Government.

The interest of the Hon. Members was heightened when they were presented with the huge revenue that accrues to the Federal Government through the Bureau of Public Enterprises (BPE) and the Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited, the Rivers State Government and the host communities through their respective equity holdings in the company.

The Indorama CTO also informed the Committee members that Indorama has a dedicated export jetty at Onne Port Complex, which receives 65,000 MT ship for export of bulk Urea.

He also shared the vision of the company in investing more in the country, especially a Methanol Plant.

"Indeed, Indorama is a model for other privatized companies to emulate," Rt. Hon. Hamisu Ibrahim Chidari said.

The CTO then delved on the key challenge facing the company which is the drastic shortage in the supply of Natural Gas Liquid (NGL), its feedstock for both polymer (Petrochemicals) and fertilizer production. According to him, this shortage in supply has made it impossible for Indorama to meet the demands of customers across the country.

"Nigeria has great potential for petrochemicals if we have the feedstock," Mr Sivadas said. The Committee Chairman, Rt. Hon. Hamisu Ibrahim Chidari promised to take the issue up and see how the challenge can be resolved to enable the company to resume full production at installed capacity.

The other Indorama Executives at the meeting included Mr Pradeep Ekka, head of HR Department, Dr Jossy Nkwocha, Head of Corporate Communications; Anil Rana, of the MD's office; Mr Kendrick Oluka, Head of Community Relations and Mr Armit Bharti of the Abuja office.

Others were Engr Ernest Ikpuku of Indorama fertilizer; Engr. Osaki Dokubo, Plant Shift Superintendent (PSS) on duty; Mr Innocent Kpenden, Manager Logistics; Mr Tosin Adalumo, Manager Materials Warehouse; Orie Uduma, Manager Training, Bashir Mohammed, Safety Coordinator; Toyin Olansebe of Environment department, among others.

Mr Sivadas, the CTO thanked the Chairman and the other Hon. Members of the Committee for their visit and their promise to look into the gas challenge facing the company.

He sympathized with the company over its Gas supply challenge. He ppromised that NMDPRA will work with Indorama in helping to solve the gas supply problem.

At the end, Mr Ogaree said he was overwhelmed and highly impressed with what he saw within the Indorama complex. "We will work together with you to alleviate your challenges and make sure you achieve your goals and plans," he said.

105 meritorious Scholarships to students in 25 Nigerian Universities

he importance of education in the development of a society cannot be overstated. It serves as the foundation for long-term innovation and development.

Education is essential in any country, but it is especially more important in developing countries such as Nigeria. Education is critical to breaking the cycle of poverty, empowering individuals, and promoting economic growth and development.

However, as the country's economy continues to deteriorate, an unprecedented number of homes are falling into poverty, making education a secondary priority. More university students are dropping out of school due to financial constraints, which frequently increases the pool of street gangs, leading to socioeconomic problems and insecurity in the country.

More concerning is the number of female dropouts whose education has not always been prioritized due to cultural and social beliefs, and who frequently work in low-wage, unethical positions.

In Nigeria, Indorama Fertilizer is taking the bull by the horns to ensure that good quality education is

available to all, regardless of location. An organization whose core value is knowledge, and which goes to great lengths to alleviate people's plight by providing scholarships to intelligent and bright students, many of whom are from low-income backgrounds.

The Indorama Fertilizer Undergraduate Scholarship for Reward of Academic Excellence (IFUSRAE) is an annual undergraduate study program that aims to promote academic excellence among agricultural students while also meeting the agricultural industry's demand for quality manpower by providing financial support and encouragement to deserving young Nigerian students from agricultural faculties in Nigerian tertiary institutions. The scholarship program is just one of the many ways Indorama Eleme Fertilizer and Chemicals Limited shows its dedication to the educational development of Nigerian students.

Since its inception in 2021, the scholarship program has awarded scholarships to brilliant students, particularly those of low socioeconomic status. Bright students who previously had no hope of completing tertiary education have been given a springboard to succeed academically

without the pressure of financial constraints.

Since its inception in 2021, a greater bias towards awarding more female students has been implemented. This is especially true given that the number of females in agriculture is lower than expected, and the importance of women in agriculture cannot be overstated in the quest for food security.

Furthermore, investing in women's education has long-term benefits that go beyond the individual. Educated women are more likely to invest in their children's education, thereby perpetuating a positive cycle of educational attainment for future generations. This, in turn, can result in a more knowledgeable and skilled workforce, thereby contributing to national development.

The IFUSRAE has received praise from both the government and the private sector of the country. Stakeholders in education have praised Indorama Fertilizer's efforts to encourage and revamp the dwindling educational system, particularly in terms of rewarding academic excellence, which is currently undervalued, discouraging current youths from furthering their education.

Over the years, the recipients have achieved great academic success, with their grades improving since the scholarship was awarded.

The educational sector in Nigeria cannot be revamped and transformed overnight, but with Indorama Fertilizer leading the way in empowering students in their academic pursuits, it is only a matter of time before the educational sector becomes great again.

They were then taken to the PE Bagging and warehouse section to see the product of the plant operations, and to understand the bagging processes and technology. igeria experiences sporadic outbreak of LASSA FEVER from time to time, this year also there is an outbreak of Lassa hemorrhagic fever in the North at Kaduna state. Lassa fever belongs to the group of VHF (Viral hemorrhagic fever), it is generally a self-limiting disease. Some important information about this disease and precautions to be taken are as follows:

WHAT IS LASSA FEVER?

Lassa fever (LF) is a disease caused by infection from Lassa fever virus (LFV). Interestingly the Lassa virus got its name from Nigeria; in 1969 the virus was first described in the town Lassa town, in Borno state.

The Lassa fever can also be referred to as Lassa hemorrhagic fever (LHF). About 80% of people infected with the LV don't come down with the illness, but one in five of infected persons can come down with severe illness and may lead to death if untreated.

The disease has a high potential of causing an outbreak. The illness course is acute thus in weeks will run its natural history. The LV is a member of the Arenaviridae virus family (are RNA viruses).

HOW IS IT TRANSMITED?

This virus is transmitted to humans from infected animals (rodents),but can also be contacted from infected humans. Humans encountering the urine and feaces of infected rats can get infected. Contact with an LV infected person or body fluids is also a way of contacting the disease.

Lassa Fever (LF) is sexually transmitted but not air-borne and luckily not transmitted by mosquitoes. The LV can remains in the urine up to nine weeks and in the semen up to three months after the course of the illness. The remains of victims are also infective.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF THE DISEASE?

The symptoms of the LF start to present about one to three weeks after getting infected. Symptoms are due to LV deleterious effect on the nervous, respiratory, cardiovascular, renal, and gastrointestinal systems.

Some of the symptoms includes:

ONSET; Fever, malaise, weakness, headaches, sore throat, muscle pain, chest pain, nausea, diarrhoea.

LATER/SEVERE

Vomiting, Abdominal pain, bleeding

from the mouth, nose, vagina, low blood pressure, seizures, disorientation, deafness.

Death usually occurs within 2 weeks of onset in fatal cases. LF is also especially severe in third trimester of pregnancy.

HOW CAN I PREVENT GETTING IT?

Good community hygiene. This discourages rats from proliferating and coming in contact with humans and our food stuffs. Measures like disposing refuse far from homes, maintaining clean households and storing foodstuffs in rodent proof containers.

Basic hand washing. Pest /rodent control.

Do not eat bush animal meat that can be classified as rodents.

Stay away from infected people.

CAN IT BE TREATED?

Yes! Early medical attention can increase the chances of survival. The drug Ribavirin has been very effective in the treatment especially when started early. In severe cases however, intensive medical care is needed.

He appreciated the knowledge, professional acumen, confidence and trust he gained over the years in Indorama.


